Why Seek an Evaluation?

At Knippenberg, Patterson, Langley & Associates, we provide psychological testing for children and adults with a variety of different needs. Your evaluator can help you come to a better understanding of yourself and your struggles whether it is to clarify a diagnosis or to simply help you discover your child's learning style or why he or she behaves in a certain manner. Most importantly, testing can help you figure out effective solutions to challenges in the classroom, in relationships, and in life.

Testing Specifics

Evaluations conducted at K,P,L&A are comprised of tests focusing on your child's abilities. All evaluations are based on four primary types of psychological testing. Testing results consist of a written report and feedback session focusing on future treatment options individually tailored to your child's diagnosis. A personalized treatment plan will help with parenting, education, socialization and extra resources for your child. We also offer to attend a meeting with the child's school to explain testing results and help create a plan for accommodation and academic success. These findings are derived from hours of testing as well as interviews with family, teachers and providers.

Types of Psychological Testing

Cognitive Testing

- This testing measures a student's intellectual abilities and shows how a child solves problems, how he/she processes information, memory, and speed of processing information.

Educational Testing

- This testing compares a student's academic functioning with other children the same age. Testing can focus on reading, writing, math, and oral language. Several sections within each major area are assessed.

Emotional/Personality Testing

- This testing provides information on your child's emotional well-being and is assessed through a series of interviews, observations, rating scales, and projective testing.

Autism Spectrum Testing

- This testing assesses for Autism Spectrum Disorders through observation, development interviews, cognitive testing, and the Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule—2.
