He has written for numerous professional publications and the news media, and has also added his work on exceptional students and child development to multiple books. General Information

Our *CONNECT* socialization groups are designed to help children and teens improve social skills in the following areas:

- Getting along with others
- Making friends and keeping them
- Handling and expressing frustration
- Improving self-esteem and self-confidence
- Learning cooperation
- Practicing problem solving and conflict resolution
- Handling teasing

In the *CONNECT* model, participants learn to interact with peers and adults in a goal-directed, engaging and fun environment. Group discussion, practice and mastery of real-life situations, and other structured activities, illustrate concepts such as cooperation, sharing, teamwork, understanding nonverbal communication and the awareness of one's own and other's feelings. The socialization groups are designed for children who:

- Act out or withdraw in social situations
- Have a poor self-image
- Know what to do but have trouble doing it (a performance-based deficit like ADHD)
- Struggle in social settings (a knowledge-based deficit, such as nonverbal learning disorder and/or autism spectrum disorders)

Screenings will be conducted March through June to determine whether individual children will benefit from the program. There will be no charge for this session or for two additional feedback sessions offered to parents during the course of the group.

Scheduling, Fees and Leaders

Group Schedule

All groups meet from the week of June 11 through the week of September 10. Call for the exact dates of each group. Group size is limited to 8–11 children. Grade distinctions are approximate, depending on the individual child and his/her screening results.

Group Fees

1 hour session: \$54.00 per session
1.5 hour session: \$80.00 per session
2.5 hour session \$120.00 per session

A deposit equal to the cost of the first group is required following the initial screening in order to secure enrollment. The deposit is credited toward the first session and is non-refundable if participation is cancelled after the start of the group.
